Did you finish a few UnFinishedObjects this summer? Did you start a new quilt or two? Did you work on Christmas projects? Did you attend any quilt shows? I hope you got a chance to see the Billings Farm and Museum in Woodstock's *Vermont Quilt Sampler*. I was impressed with the range of talent from all around

the state on display, both in the fiber quilts and the barn quilts decorating buildings on the grounds. Perhaps you even participated in one of the six guild Saturdays for showing your art, selling raffle tickets, and demonstrating techniques. # Fall Program: Demostrations

By popular demand, this year's fall GMQG program will again feature four demonstrations by members. Two will be presented in the morning and two in the afternoon, with both workshops repeating so that everyone can enjoy all four in the day. Here's what you can look forward to learning about:

- ◆ Temperature Quilts The hottest thing among quilters when a new year starts! Tess Greaves will show her version of a temperature quilt and discuss various ways of creating them, including choosing colors and patterns to help you get ready for 2025 and, perhaps, keep working on them all year long.
- Am I a Modern Quilter or a Traditional One? Soni Johnson, a member of several quilt guilds
  including one focused on modern quilts, will discuss what your "style" might be and how quilters' views of those styles have changed over time.
- Making a Flannel Rag Quilt Is this the year you'll make all your loved ones rag quilts? They're easy gifts that all ages find cozy. Veteran flannel rag quilt maker, Suzy Klinefelter, will break down the process for you.
- Tools, Tips and Techniques Joanne Latrell often visits the hardware store to find useful
  quilting gadgets. She'll show and tell her favorite collection of items and techniques from various sources that are useful to quilters.



# Disappearing Nine-Patch Raffle Block

The GMQG Fall Meeting quilt block raffle is the "Disappearing 9-Patch" block. The theme is Winter Wonderland — think trees and snow and holly berries and the like. The pattern makes a 13 inch finished star block. *Soni Johnson, Vice President* 

#### Disappearing 9-Patch Quilt Block Instructions

#### Step 1: Make the 9-Patch

Arrange 5" squares as follows (see diagram 1)

- single contrast square in the center—this should be a nice holiday/holly berry red
- 2. 4 light squares surrounding the center—think sparkling /shimmering snow
- 3. 4 dark squares in the outside corners—these could be lovely greens and/or golds

Sew into rows, press each row toward the darker fabric. Sew the rows together.


Press flat. Should measure 14 inches unfinished.

#### Step 2: Cut the 9-Patch

Cut in half in both directions as follows (see diagram 2)

- 1. Lay ruler on the seam line at 2 ¼ inches. Make the cut in the center of the block (cut 1).
- 2. Without moving the block, lay the ruler on the horizontal seam line at 2 ¼ inches. Make the cut in the center of the block (cut 2).

The 4 unfinished sub blocks should measure 7 inches each.



#### Step 3: Rearrange the Sub Blocks

Turn as follows (see diagram 3):

- 1. Top right, 1 turn to the right.
- 2. Bottom right, 2 turns to the right.
- 3. Bottom left, I turn to the left.

Sew the sub blocks together in rows.

Sew rows together. Press.

Unfinished block measurers 13.5 inches.

The 9 – Patch has disappeared!! (Diagram 4)



# A Guild Challenge for 2025



Marcus Fabrics recently issued a collection of *Bentley's Snowflakes* fabric, "inspired by the early photography of Wilson A. Bentley, taken in 1885, which captured the microscopic details and crystalline structures of actual snowflakes. In 1903 he shared these images with the Smithsonian; these were later added to the Smithsonian's archives."

The collection, in both navy blue and charcoal colorways, includes a panel of 8" snowflakes along with coordinating snowy fabrics. These images have special meaning in Vermont because Bentley was born and worked in Jericho,

Vermont. According to *Wikipedia*, Bentley (1865-1931) "was the first known person to take detailed photographs of snowflakes and record their features. He perfected a process of catching flakes on black velvet in such a way that their images could be captured before they either melted or sublimated, and elaborated the theory that no two snowflakes are alike."

Bentley photographed over 5,000 snowflakes during his life, which was a remarkable feat because he used very elementary equipment. Many Vermont libraries own his first book published soon before his death, *Snow Crystals* (McGraw-Hill, 1931), as well as the Caldecott Award-winning picture biography *Snowflake Bentley*, by Jacqueline Briggs Martin and illustrated by Mary Azarian.

As president of the Green Mountain Quilters Guild, I feel it is fitting to issue a challenge to guild members in honor of this important Vermonter. See if you can create an original quilted item (quilt, wall hanging, potholder, table runner, tote bag, etc.) using some of the *Bentley's Snowflakes* fabric for show and tell at our May, 2025 meeting. I'm interested to see what you all come up with!

# Green Mountain Quilters Guild Spring Meeting 2024 May 11, 2024 Our Lady of the Angels Catholic Church, Randolph, Vermont Business Meeting Minutes

**President** Marianne Kotch opened the business meeting at 9:30 am with announcements from the members. We held a moment of silence for members who had recently passed away, followed by the introduction of GMQG board members, new members, and visitors. In the absence of Recording Secretary Liz Achilles, we dispensed with approval of the minutes of the fall, 2023, meeting and Marianne volunteered to take notes.

**Treasurer** Robin Mascitti presented a report, including a proposed budget for 2024-25. She said we are in fine shape but need to continue fund raising in order to pay good speakers in the future. The board will create a quilt as a fund raiser during the summer. The top will be ready to show at the fall meeting and we hope someone in the guild will volunteer to quilt it. Tickets will be sold during 2025 at various guild meetings and shows around the state. *Nola Forbes moved and Linda Toohey seconded that the budget for 2024-25 as presented be approved. The motion carried.* 

**Webmasters** Jan Sherman and Sandy Wilmot reported that the new GMQG **website** had 284 visitors since it went "live" this spring and 546 pages were viewed. The most popular page was the one offering information about barn quilts. Sandy also reported that the GMQG Facebook page has 110 members.

Marianne introduced the day's main speaker, **Christine Maute**, a long time GMQG member who also belongs to the Northern Lights Quilt Guild. Chris showed a fine array of quilts she had made as the result of various local guild challenges and her own curiosity. Each quilt revealed Chris' creativity, energy, and interest in experimentation with paints, hardware, stabilizers, buckram, and more. Everyone seemed inspired and most came to look at Chris' work closeup during the break.

Soni Johnson organized the day's **Show and Tell** session and said that she hoped to broaden the categories next time. During lunch, members shopped in the vendor area and placed bids on items in the Quilters Auction.

After lunch, Sherlock Terry of the **Billings Farm and Museum** talked about this summer's *Vermont Quilt Sampler* exhibits and programs. The museum has over 70,000 visitors per year, and its 100+ antique quilts are currently being reviewed by quilt historian Gerald Roy. This year, the museum has commissioned 14 barn quilts for display on the farm buildings, and the annual quilt exhibit will include 56 juried pieces to be displayed all summer. There will be several "guild days" with demos, shows, and sales on select Saturdays. Sherlock also mentioned that the UVM's Fleming Museum is planning a quilt display at the end of the summer.

Robin announced that the fat quarter auction netted the guild \$420, about what she had hoped for. She also mentioned that we had sold 48 books that were given to the guild for fundraising.

Raffle and auction winners were drawn, and the meeting was adjourned at 2:30 pm. The fall meeting will be held on **Saturday, November 9, 2024**, again at Our Lady of the Angels, Randolph.
