Susan Damone Balch Headlines Spring Meeting



If you attended the Vermont Quilt Festival back in the 1990s and 2000s, you may have been as awestruck as I was when you saw Susan Damone Balch's fish quilts. To me, they were abstract and realistic at the same time, often with muted colors and interesting piecing. These award winners were inspiring and among the first art quilts I encountered in my own quilting journey.

The Green Mountain Quilters Guild is honored that Susan, a resident of Reading, will be speak-

ing at our spring meeting on May 10 in Randolph. Susan will offer a trunk show featuring her fish quilts as well as later works which have mostly been "liberated" log cabin quilts. She will tell us about her experiences teaching quilting at the Fletcher Farm School until last year when it took a pause and now organizing and teaching at the new CreateTogetherVT in Ludlow.

Susan's website, <u>http://www.fishnquilt.com</u>, offers a brief biography and some photos of her quilts for sale. She started quilting in 1978 and, as she says, "a desire to capture the beauty and intrigue of fly fishing and nature in fabric led her to create stylized pictorials using smooth curved lines." She enjoys choosing just the right fabrics for her work and often lets the fabric tell her what to create with it. This has led her to more intuitive piecing which she currently teaches. Susan's blue and white liberated log cabin quilt (above) won a Juror Award at the 2023 Billings Farm Museum show.

Spring Cleaning? Remember The Quilters Auction!

One quilter's trash is another quilter's treasure! After the long winter stuck (ha!) inside quilting, does your sewing room now need a thorough spring cleaning? Gather up all your unwanted, unneeded items and take them to the GMQG spring meeting. The Quilters Auction is a popular part of the day and our main fundraiser of the year. Akin to a "teacup auction" or "trick tray auction," our auction works this way:

- Anyone can bring items for auction to the May 10 meeting. If your home contains smokers, please give your donations a good airing before bringing them. The more items there are, the greater your chance of "winning" something.
- Definitely bring quilting-related items, but bundles of fat quarters, yardage, thread, notions, books, yarn, beads, embellishments, homemade jam, baskets, plants, books, and more are welcome.
- Arrive at the meeting early to give your donations to our volunteers. Or, feel free to give your items to a GMQG board member before the meeting for delivery that day.
- Volunteers will receive and set out the items for bidding. They may decide to combine items by theme or divide them up, depending on what else is available.
- Tickets for bidding will be sold before and during the meeting (\$10 for a card of 21 tickets).
- Each item or group of items will have a paper bag taped to the table in front of it. Put as many tickets as you'd like into the bag. The more tickets you put in, the better your chances of winning.
- Winners will be drawn toward the end of the day so that you can take your items home. If you need to leave early, ask a friend to take your winnings home.
- All proceeds will help GMQG offer more excellent programs in the future.

Down the Garden Path Raffle Block

Unfinished Size: 12.5 inches


This is a simple 9-patch made up of half square triangles (HSTs) and is all about color. The fun will really start when you win the block raffle and can play with the layout of your garden path!

Fabric Needs

Enough 5-inch square scraps to make [9] 4.5-inch HSTs. You will need bright flower fabric for the flower beds and greens, browns, and grays for the garden paths.


Block Construction

Use your favorite method to make [9] HSTs. One side will be part of the flower bed and the other part of the garden path. Trim each HST to 4.5" x 4.5" and sew together to match the layout diagram below.

Is Our Website Attracting Viewers?



We are into our 3rd year with a new website. We have measures that allow us to understand who visits our site, where they come from, and what they view. We can use this to improve the materials and information to encourage more visitors.

Here's what we know. We've increased views by 38%(1,700) over the last 12 months and while most viewers are from the U.S., we also get international visitors. While many visitors already know our web address, we get referred to from search engines (like google), facebook and even the Billings Farm (from their quilt events). The most popular pages that our viewers visit are the Barn Quilt Trail, Vermont Quilt Guilds (the local guilds), and our Meeting page. We'd love to hear your ideas about additional materials to include.

An underutilized tool is our facebook page. We currently have 118 members but the activity is very low. Ideas on improving this would be great!
